32. Details on student enrichment programmes (special lectures/ workshops/ seminar) with external experts:

The following enrichment programmes were organized for the students. The Sociology Association also manages the Women Development Cell of the college and together they organizes a wide range of enrichment programs for students to sensitize them to different societal issues.

- Students were guided to conduct a survey on diet and hygiene among the slum dwellers in Ghatkopar area. 200 students participated in the survey and collected information from 500 residents. Even though there diet was poor the parents were aware about the balanced diet. The sanitary and general hygiene was very poor. This was sponsored by Policy Innovation.
- 200 students carried out community welfare activity along with Sesame India Ltd.
- One teacher carried out gender audit of the girl

students of our college and advised them about healthy diet.

33. Teaching methods adopted to improve student learning:

- Chalk and talk is the main method of teaching. In addition to that other techniques are used. Some of them are Debates, discussions, real-life events are used during classroom teaching to help the students understand particular issues.
- Film shows followed by discussion.
- The students are encouraged to give their opinions which help them to think independently and express themselves.
- All students attend workshops organized by AKSHARA which teaches self confidence, leadership, gender sensitization program.
