## 5.1 Student Mentoring and Support

Yes, our institution publishes prospectus annually. The prospectus is updated annually. It provides information on the founders, mission and vision, courses offered, rules and regulations pertaining to admission, fees, refund, attendance, evaluation, freeships and scholarships, prizes, co-curricular and extracurricular activities. It also provides information regarding rules pertaining to ragging, vigilance squad to keep premises gender friendly and role of Women Development Cell. In addition students are given information pamphlets at the time of admission to provide information about the admission schedule as announced by the University of Mumbai. **5.1.2 Specify the type, number and amount of institutional scholarships/ freeships given to the students during the last four years and whether the financial aid was available and disbursed on time?**

The institution has a dedicated team of administrative staff who look after the freeships and scholarships which are available to the students. In the beginning of the academic year students are informed about the various freeships and scholarships which are available to them. The institutional freeships are available from the student welfare fund. These freeships include tuition fee waiver, free books. These students are taken on field trips free of charge. In addition the college has endowment prizes which are awarded to the students (Annexure IX, pg. 264). The administrative staff is trained in the rules and regulations to timely disburse these scholarships/freeships. Students are informed by displaying notices and on websites. They are also sent SMS and informed telephonically.

About 10% students receive financial assistance from various agencies.

**5.1.4 What are the specific support services/facilities available for the students**

A large section of the student community belongs to the economically weaker section of the society.

- They are allowed to pay fees in easy installments.
- In case they are not able to pay fees, the fee is waived or it is paid through the student welfare fund or a mentor pays the fees of the student.
- Students are provided free books from the book bank. They are allowed to use the reading room facility for extended period of time which includes all holidays.
- For the past nine years the college has a scheme of "Earn while Learn" which provides part time job opportunity for the student in the campus to tide over their economic crisis, at the same time it also enables them to acquire skills essential for office jobs. Some of these students who have shown satisfactory progress have been employed by the

college.

- Students from SC/ST, OBC and economically weaker sections: The College ensures that the students are charged only the minimum fees as prescribed for students from reserve category. They are also guided to fill the freeship/scholarship forms. Tuition fee is waived for the children of the supporting staff and they are given free books from the book bank.
- Students with physical disabilities: Students with Physical disabilities are provided with support services like availability of lift, rails for support, wheel chair if needed, supporting staff help as attendants. Availability of writer/ Reader for visually challenged, availability of special software "JAWS" for students with partial vision. We encourage them to participate in all the activities of the college promoting inclusive education.
- Students to participate in various competitions/ National and International: Students when they participate in national and international events are provided with travelling allowance and hospitality like accommodation and food.
- Medical assistance to students: Health centre, health insurance etc. on campus injuries and ailments, group insurance:
- All students are covered by a group Insurance Policy. First Aid facilities are available in the office, staff room, girls' common room, Gymkhana and all the departments to take care of minor injuries. A doctor Dr Vipul Joshi is available on call on all days and a local Physician Dr Rammana is also available on call to visit the college in case it is felt essential. Our institution has an understanding with "NIDAN" which is a diagnostic centre equipped with all modern diagnostic facilities like Sonography, MRI, ECG etc. and they have Ambulance available 24/7. It is owned by our alumni Dr Shailendra Singh who is a family member of our managing committee. In addition we have an understanding with "Harshal Heart Hospital" which has ICU to tackle any emergency. This hospital is within ½ Km from the college. In addition there is a Municipal Hospital "Rajawadi Hospital" which is 3 Km away and Hindu Sabha a multifacility hospital 100 metres away.
- Organizing coaching classes for competitive exams: Students take guidance from teachers when they are preparing for competitive exams. The NCC In charge has maintained a library which has books for preparing for these competitive exams. Students approach him and avail this facility.
- Skill development (spoken English, computer literacy etc.): Since majority of the students in our college come from vernacular medium there is need for developing their communication skills.

The subject of communication skills and business communications is included in the Arts faculty. Students are trained in learning English using the English Language Lab. All students are encouraged to become computer literate and are provided knowledge of basic computing skills. In addition, our institution also runs Add on courses in learning computer languages.

- Support for "slow learners" mentoring extra coaching: Majority of the departments have a tutor ward system. The teacher mentor provides extra coaching, allows them to learn in his/her own pace and builds confidence in them to become achievers.
- Exposures of students to other institution of higher learning/ corporate/business house etc.: Students are encouraged to participate in competitions organized by other colleges and also intercollegiate competitions are organized in our college. This provides a platform for interacting with students of other Institutions. Student seminars are another forum to encourage such interactions. Students get an opportunity to interact with personnel from corporate/business houses during the industrial visits. All departments have an association or club in which illustrious guests are invited from corporate/business houses/institutions of higher learning/ research organizations where students get an opportunity to interact with them and also develop contacts which help them in internships and placements.
- Publication of student magazines: Students are encouraged to contribute in the college magazine.

#### *5.1.5 Describe the efforts made by the institution to facilitate entrepreneurial skills, among the students and the impact of the efforts.*

- Our college has an Entrepreneurship development Cell named "Swayam" which is aimed at creating entrepreneurial skills among students. Workshops are conducted to teach the students to make Fashion Jewellery, Rakhis, Greeting cards, Hand-made papers.
- Lectures are organized by leading entrepreneurs who guide the students regarding the various government schemes which are available, how to develop a business plan, how to raise finance and how to manage a company.
- Talks are also arranged featuring success stories.
- Bank personnel are invited to give talks on loan venture capital facility available and the procedure for raising a loan.
- In the career fair "VISTAS" a panel for Entrepreneurship is displayed.
- Many subjects have entrepreneurship as a part of

the curriculum.

- To enhance the perception of students for business and entrepreneurial ventures students are sent for internships.
- Being economically underprivileged students have a strong survival instinct and as mentioned earlier most of them are working. They learn the ropes of business and start their own business.
- The department of Banking and Insurance organized an exhibition on various banking and entrepreneurial sectors in India for the benefit of all students.

**5.1.6 Enumerate the policies and strategies of the institution which promote participation of students in extracurricular and co-curricular activities such as sports, games, Quiz competitions, debate and discussions, cultural activities etc.**

The management of the college strongly believes in all round development of the students and thus provides for amenities essential to promote participation of students in extra and co-curricular activities including sports. The sports directors are helped by team of teachers to encourage different sports. The cultural association has a team of teachers and enthusiastic team of students who coordinate all the participation in cultural activities. The 20 plus associations ensure that opportunity is provided to maximum students for participation in various co-curricular activities. The committee ensures timely dissemination of information regarding various competitions and facilitating in sending entries.

**5.1.7 Enumerating on the support and guidance provided to the students in preparing for the competitive exams, give details on the number of students appeared and qualified in various competitive exams such as CSIR-NET, UGC-NET, SLET, ATE/CAT/ GRE/TOFEL/GMAT/Central/State services, Defense, Civil Services, etc.**

Workshops and seminars are organized to train students on how to prepare for competitive examinations. All PG departments provide students with information on preparing for the various eligibility tests, study material is made available. Guidance lectures on study abroad and information on various competitive examinations is also organized by the Career and Placement cell of the college.

Notices regarding schedules, exam pattern are displayed on notice boards.

- The institution regularly organizes seminars/ guest lectures/ workshops/ fairs for informing the students on the various competitive exams, and the modality of examinations

- Students are notified on the forthcoming educational fairs organized by leading groups like Times Education Bouquet, Education Abroad etc.
- Students are trained in mock entrance tests, group discussions, interview techniques, personal grooming
- Our students are more inclined towards appearing for entrance exams for MBA, hence seminars are organized that help them prepare for CAT/ CET, Group Discussions and Personal Interviews
- Some of our staff members are engaged in coaching students for MPSC and UPSC examinations at the Government training center and University of Mumbai.
- In certain streams like Biotechnology 50% of the students appear and qualify for GRE and TOFEL. They are provided with guidance and study material. The institution also helps them in short listing the Universities, writing SOP's, recommendations and transcripts are promptly provided.
- Many students pass the MCAT for admission for the MMS program in University of Mumbai

### 5.1.8 What type of counseling services are made available to the students (academic, personal, career, psycho-social etc.)

- There is a full-fledged counselling center with a professional counselor and a trainee. They look after the personal counselling of the students.
- The activities of the counselling centers include Psychometrics tests, aptitude test including emotional quotient and personality testing.
- They conduct workshops for stress management, anger, personality, interview and communication skills.
- Personal counselling on one to one basis is provided, and this has improved the quality of students' life.

### 5.1.9 Does the institution have a structured mechanism for career guidance and placement of its students? If 'yes', detail on the services provided to help students identify job opportunities and prepare themselves for interview and the percentage of students selected during campus interviews by different employers (list the employers and the programmes).

Yes, with the appointment of the full time placement office four years back there is a structured mechanism for career guidance and placement of our students.

- Students are informed about the various companies coming on campus for recruitment by notices displayed on notice boards that are strategically located in the college and also on the website.
- A placement officer is available for the students for the entire day who liaises with the industry and arranges for campus recruitment, thereby making it a student friendly environment for interviews. He organizes lectures/seminars/ workshops on various careers.
- An annual Career Fair "VISTAS" is organized by the career and placement cell.
- Training programs in Functional English, Communication Skills, Personality Development, CV Writing, Group Discussion and Interview techniques are conducted by the Placement Officer, to enhance the skills of the students and increase their chances for selection at interviews.
- Workshops and seminars are conducted in various areas like Personality Development, Group Discussions, Interview Techniques, how to prepare for competitive examinations like CAT, CET etc.
- Department wise career talks are delivered to students which orients the students to the various career avenues open to them.
- The departments of IT, BMS, BBI and Computer Science conduct special training programs for the students to prepare them for aptitude test, group

discussions, technical skills and interview.

- Different types of companies are brought on campus for recruitment thus catering to the needs of students of different specializations.
- The placement cell also organizes Pool campus for some companies like L&T and Navteq
- The placement officer has excellent communication with the students via SMS, institution website and via face book page.

**5.1.10 Does the institution have a student grievance redressal cell? If yes, list (if any) the grievances reported and redressed during the last four years.**

Yes, the college has a student grievance cell.

- The student may approach the student council.
- They can also avail the facility of the suggestion box
- Anti-ragging squad and anti-ragging committee and the vigilance squad take precautionary measures
- Open door policy of the authorities

All these basically register grievances if any and are brought to the timely notice of the Heads' of the Departments, Vice Principal's and Principal for timely solutions. To bring about accountability and transparency all the student service counters have name plates with the work allotment and timings of work. This has reduced the number of complaints from the students regarding services being rendered by the college. Since the management of the institution is totally participatory no major grievances have been registered. We strongly believe in the concept that precaution is better than cure.

A Womens Development Cell has been established as per the circular issued by the University of Mumbai WDC/GenCorp/35 of 2005 dated 11 August, 2005. The composition of the WDC at the college level is as per the guideline. It consists of

The Principal functions as the ex officio president of the cell. The committee also works as a grievance redressal committee for sexual harassment.

- It has carried out workshops and talks on gender sensitization (both male and female), health of girl students, pre-marital counselling, gender issues, legal aspects related to women, female foeticide, domestic violence and women, women empowerment and self-defense.
- Visit to tribal area by staff and students to gather firsthand information regarding the status of women in that society.
- CWDC members along with students and NGO (Ladli) attended seminars related to women issues.
- CWDC along with NGO's like SNEHA, MAWA, AKSHARA conducted workshops on eve teasing,

gender friendly premises

- CWDC along with NSS and university of Mumbai conducted workshop on Gender equality which talks, skits and street-play
- CWDC with WDC of University of Mumbai organized a two day National seminar on "Sexual Harassment in Higher Education Institutions" which had more than 150 participants and eminent resource persons.

Yes there is an anti-ragging committee and anti-ragging squad in the college. UGC regulation on ragging is promptly displayed in strategic location. It is also available on the Institutional website and in the college prospectus. There has been no report on ragging in the premises.

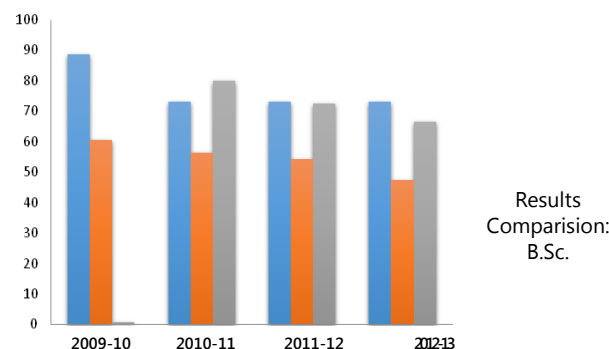
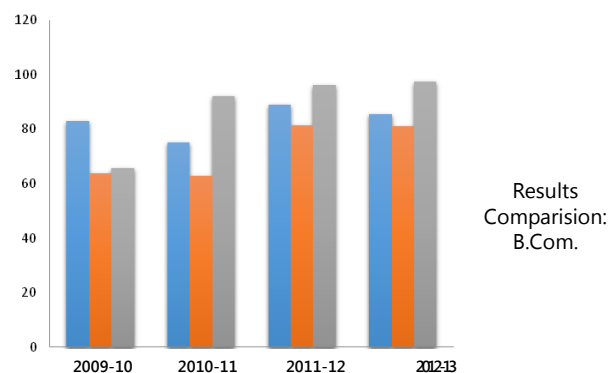
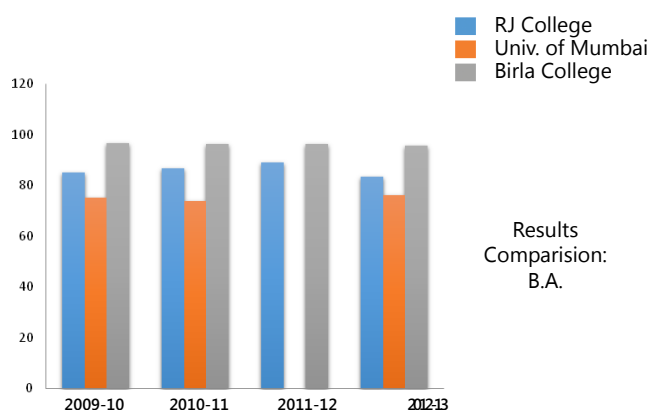

### 5.2.3 How does the institution facilitate student progression to higher level of education and/or towards employment?

The student centric education followed in our Institution follows a multiple approaches to facilitate student progression to a higher level/or towards employment. Individual departments along with the career and placement cell conduct seminars to educate students on the various avenues which are available to them. The librarian also displays the career opportunities which appear in the newspapers and magazines. Teacher mentors interact with the students to find out the area of their interest. Aptitude tests help the students to narrow down their options. The placement cell chalks out series of seminars which help the student identify their career path. Employment is enabled through the placement cell wherein the students register for placement whenever the companies come to campus for recruitments. Teachers also provide referrals to Institutions of higher education and prospective employers.

### 5.2.4 Enumerate the special support provided to students who are at risk of failure and drop out?

- Personal and professional counselling are the two important strategies adopted by the institution to minimize dropout rates.
- The students hailing from socio-economically weaker sections are allowed to pay fees in easy installments, or are provided with time for payment of fees or provided with financial support. They are also given scholarships and freships wherever applicable.
- The 'Earn while you Learn' scheme helps students to take care of their financial needs and develops self-confidence.
- Parents meeting gives a further insight on their family structure, environment and during these interactions, teachers are able to form a close tie with the student and parents.
- The counselor also interacts with the students and she gives appointments for students who are in a risk group for greater counseling and corrective therapy is used.
- Department-wise remedial coaching is offered to students who have failed or have A.T.K.T. in the particular subject.

## 5.3 Student Participation and Activities

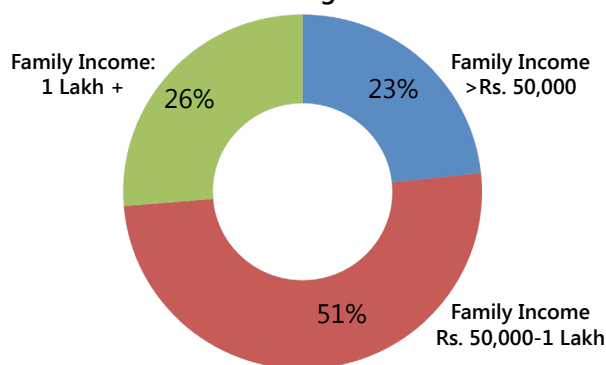

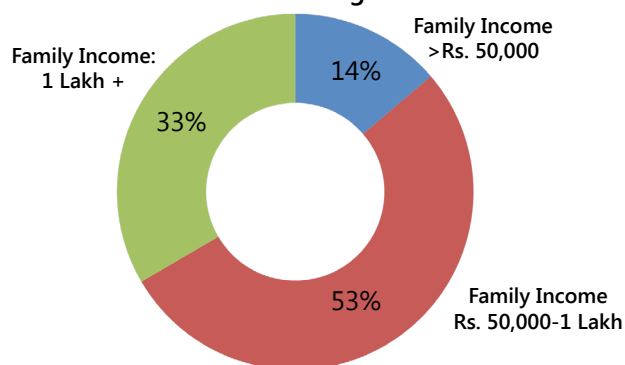
**5.3.7 How does the institution network and collaborate with the Alumni and former faculty of the Institution.**

- Our alumni bring their ward to join our institution which reflects their institutional loyalty.

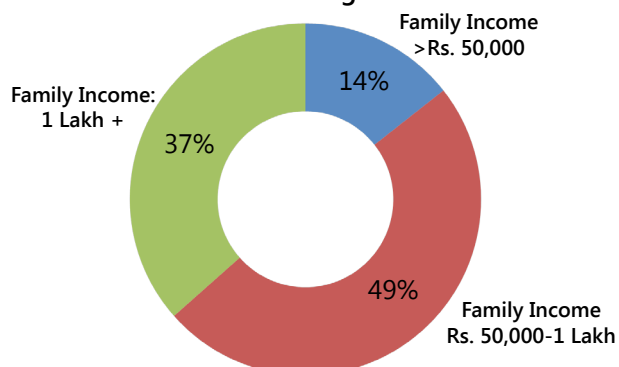
