Chemistry Department

The meeting of BOS in chemistry was held on Saturday 2nd February, 2019 at 11 00 am in the chemistry department.

Dr. S. D. Samant, Dr. M. V. V. Ramana & Mr. Ganesh Malvankar were present along with department teachers.

Dr. Rajesh Vatsa (BARC) – leave of absence, Dr. R. S. Dubey, Dr. Manisha Bhattacharya were on leave & Prof. Mandar Medhi was on DL.

Head of chemistry department Prof. Pratibha Singh welcomed the members & briefed them about progress of department under autonomous status. All the exams UG to PG were held in time & results also were declared in stipulated time. All the moderation was done by external examiners.

Prof. Pratibha Singh highlighted the benefits of having of participate number Students could in calendar. academic intercollegiate events & won several prizes. Guest lectures & workshops could be arranged. 45 students participated in 35th aptitude test conducted by Indian Chemical Society & 3 students won certificate of merit Many chemistry students participated in 'Certificate course on Life skills' initiated by college. College adopted the practice of 'open house' where in all students were allowed to go through their answer papers in presence of examiners. Students were highly appreciative of this practice & number of students applying for revaluation has reduced significantly.

Dr. S. D. Samant requested to review the quality of question paper viz. university paper. He expressed satisfaction that quality of question paper has improved.

He congratulated the department for the fact that in spite of better quality of paper, the result has also improved.

The department proposes to change M.Sc. Sem III & Sem IV practical syllabus for organic & inorganic chemistry so as to have project in Sem IV. Same was placed before the members & it was approved.

Minor reshuffle in S.Y.B.Sc. syllabus was also approved.

Skill enhancement course – The department proposes to start a skill enhancement course for T.Y.B.Sc. Chemistry from 2019 – 20. The syllabus for the course was discussed & it was decided to have skill enhancement course in, 'IT in chemistry & Safety in labs'.

Dr. Ramana pointed out that the syllabus should be such that it really enhances the skill of student. The final syllabus would be mailed to all members for their approval.

BOS proposes to start a new course in M.Sc. analytical chemistry from the year 2019-20. In view of the growing demand for M.Sc, particularly in subject of Analytical Chemistry, the members agreed to apply for the same. The syllabus for M.Sc Analytical programme was discussed & it will be sent to Principal madam for further action.

Head of department also informed that it was decided to conduct two internal in M.Sc. Sem II & Sem IV each of 20 marks. Dr. Ramana was of the opinion that we may have frequent internal (of 10 marks) instead.

Dr. Samant was of the opinion that student members may be included in BOS. He also suggested that department should share its best practices with other departments of college.

There being no other matter, meeting ended with thanks to the chair.
